I hope you are all relaxing during Golden Week. Today I'm going to share a story I saw on the news yesterday – about the 22 artifacts from Okinawa that were discovered in an attic in Massachusetts.

As you all may know, the Battle of Okinawa during World War II was a violent, bloody battle which resulted in 150,000 casualties. During this battle, important documents and treasures of the Ryukyu Kingdom were stolen. Fast forward to January 2023. The FBI received a complaint from a family that found some very unique items while sorting through their deceased father's belongings. Their father was a WWII veteran but never served in the Pacific Theater. In total, the FBI recovered 22 artifacts: six painted scrolls from the 18th-19th centuries, a hand-drawn map of Okinawa from the 19th century, and various pieces of pottery and ceramics.

In case you didn't know, Okinawa was an independent kingdom until 1606 when Satsuma forces invaded the land, so much of its culture is unique. The art crime coordinator for this case, Special Agent Geoffrey J. Kelly, explained that these artifacts were especially important because they depict Okinawan royalty and serve as pieces of cultural identity.
