Welcome to PR2 dictation. Today, I am going to be reading from *The Intellectual Devotional*, as usual, and today's topic is going to be on the cathedral of Notre Dame.

The Gothic cathedral of Notre Dame is located on the eastern side of the [Ile de la Cite]^{*}, an island on the River Seine in the middle of Paris. The cathedral was built on the site of an ancient Roman temple dedicated to Jupiter that was replaced in 528 by a Christian church. Inspired by the magnificence of the recently restored Abbey Church of Saint Denis, Bishop Maurice de Sully decided to tear down the old Parisian church and build a grander one. Construction on the new cathedral began in 1163^{**} and continued until the beginning of the fourteenth century. As in most Gothic cathedrals, the façade of Notre Dame has three levels. Above these rise two towers, connected by the gallery of gargoyles – sculptures of hideous beasts that were believed to keep evil spirits away from the church. Below the gallery is the rose window, which is pieced together from hundreds of stained glass [panes] and measures over thirty feet in diameter.

Okay, I will stop it there. The Notre Dame had burned down maybe two- last year, or maybe two years ago, and I actually went there, umm, earlier this year in March. But, umm, as it was expected, there were all these, umm, tarps up and it was basically a construction site, so I couldn't really see it, which was really, really sad.
