Migratory birds and mammals that expend lots of energy traveling long distances to chase food or find a choice nesting spot tend to live fast and die young, scientists reported November 17th. In a study published in Nature Communications, researchers found that migratory animals have a shorter lifespan than their homebody counterparts, but they compensate by having more offspring in less time. Analysing over 700 birds and 540 mammal species, the study determined that, from an evolutionary standpoint, neither strategy is "better" than the other. Migration can take place in the skies, underwater, or across different landscapes.

Ah! So, migratory animals might not live as long, but they achieve their purpose in life a little quicker, which I guess is the essence of the mantra, "live fast; die young", which can be taken to mean that success is not necessarily determined by how long you live, but by how much you achieve in a shorter space of time. Although, literally dying young is not recommended.
