A volcano erupted near Iceland's capital, Reykjavik, on March 19th, shooting lava high into the night sky after thousands of small earthquakes in the weeks before. The eruption occurred near Fagradalsfjall, a mountain on the Reykjanes Peninsula, around 30km southwest of the capital. Some four hours after the initial eruption – the first on the peninsula since the 12th century – lava covered about 1 square kilometer, or nearly 200 soccer fields. More than 40,000 earthquakes have occurred on the peninsula in the past four weeks.

Oh, wow! That's a lot of earthquakes in such a short space of time. And we don't often see real-world examples of lava-based volcanic eruptions like the ones we see in movies and so, while a little scary, I'm sure this event was quite exciting to a lot of journalists, photographers, and drone pilots.
