Japan will oblige business operators to reduce the provision of 12 disposable plastic items such as spoon and straws from next April to promote recycling and tackle marine pollution, the government said August 23rd. The move is based on legislation that was enacted in June to cut down on plastic waste at restaurants and retail stores. Businesses can choose from among measures including charging for the items and switching to recyclable products. Targeted plastic items also include forks, knives, combs, toothbrushes, shower caps, and clothes hangers. Businesses that fail to meet the new requirement will be advised or ordered to improve their practices.
