In 1976, David Bussau, a young Australian businessman, decided to participate in a project designed to help an Indonesian village that had been devastated by earthquake. The aim project rebuild of the was to the village's infrastructure, so he and other volunteers worked hard to repair local roads and bridges, rebuild schools, and establish water supplies. As Bussau got to know the villagers and their lives, however, he realized that the volunteer's efforts would do little to lift the village out of poverty. The real cause of their poverty, he discovered, lay not in a lack of local infrastructure, but in the debts they owed to cruel moneylenders. At the root of the problem were loan sharks - people who lent money to the poor but charged very high interest rates. Although respectable loan companies offering loans based on market interest rates existed, they didn't offer small-scale loans. Bussau reasoned that if the villagers had access to proper financing, this would allow them to escape from the cycle of poverty in which they were trapped. He and his colleagues decided to set up an organization that offered small-scale loans. The group's early efforts proved successful, and over the years it developed into a major global development association, Opportunity International. Now, the association offers small-scale loans to poor people around the world.
