Today's movie is about the disappearance of species! Let's begin.

It is hard to believe or indeed even to understand but it is a fact that almost 90 percent of all species that have existed up until now have disappeared. Norman Myers elaborates this basic point to give an approximate historical sense of the rate at which species have become extinct. Quite simply, from 1600 to 1900 human beings eliminated some seventy-five known species, mostly mammals and birds. Since 1900 to the present day, they have eliminated another seventy-five. Between 1600 and 1900 the rate of disappearance was approximately one species every four years. In the present century, the rate has been approximately one species every year. Humans cannot be held totally responsible, however, for many of these species disappeared well before Homo sapiens appeared on the planet.

Although Myers concluded his analysis in 1979, the process that he describes is undoubtedly continuing, for, as he himself said, there are currently over a thousand animal forms that may soon disappear from the Earth. In many parts of the world, concern is certainly expressed about this, but just as few animals can be recognized by the public, perhaps even fewer of these thousand forms could be named and identified.
