Today's movie is about how people in many parts of the world believe that words have magical powers. Let's get started.

There is a large amount of evidence which shows that people believe that words to have magical powers. This is most easily illustrated with those very special words, people's names. In the traditions of modern Ethiopia, the real name of a child is concealed to prevent the child from being influenced magically through the use of the name. It is believed that knowledge of the names gives power over the person who bears the name. Beliefs of this type are widespread throughout the world. In Borneo, for example, the name of a sickly child is traditionally changed so that the spirits tormenting it will be deceived and leave the child alone. The spirits, apparently, can recognize people only by their names, not through other characteristics. An extreme example was reported by the early explorers in the Marquesas Islands. There it was possible for two people to exchange names as a sign of mutual respect. But this exchange of names also involved an exchange of responsibilities: obligations concerning the family, friends, and even enemies went with the change of name. A man might even be expected to go to war because of the responsibility to his new name.
