Recent discussions about the plight of African Americans – specifically those at the bottom of the social ladder – tend to divide into two camps. On the one hand, there are those who highlight the structural constraints on the life chances of black people. Their viewpoint involves a subtle historical and sociological analysis of slavery, Jim Crowism, job and residential discrimination, skewed unemployment rates, inadequate health care, and poor education. On the other hand, there are those who stress the behavioral impediments on black upward mobility. They focus on the waning of the Protestant ethic – hard work, deferred gratification, frugality, and responsibility – in much of black [America].

Those in the first camp – the liberal structuralists – call for full employment, health, education, and child-care programs, and broad affirmative-action practices. In short, a new, more sober version of the best of the New Deal and the Great Society: more government money, more better bureaucrats, and an active citizenry. Those in the second camp – the conservative behaviorists – promote self-help programs, black business expansion, and non-preferential job practices. They support vigorous "free market" strategies that depend on fundamental changes in how black people act and live. To put it bluntly, their projects rest largely upon a cultural revival of the Protestant ethic in black America.
