It resulted in American victory and was a turning point of the American Revolutionary War.

The British strategy was to arrange three separate armies to converge near Albany. However, a number of their troops were defeated in the Battle of Bennington, resulting in reduced forces for Saratoga.

The American troops built formidable defenses, which eventually led to their victory. Ten days after the Battle of Saratoga, on October 17th, the British troops surrendered. Later in 1781, the United States officially gained independence from Great Britain.
