Last month, Hamas, the largest militant group of Palestine, attacked southern Israel, gathering attention across the globe. The media only captures and broadcasts current events, thus the younger generations tend to lack sufficient information to fully understand the conflict. Let's learn about its history today.

Much of the conflict is rooted in an event on November 29, 1947, when the United Nations voted to partition the British mandate of Palestine into a Jewish state and an Arab state. A portion of Jewish people believe that they deserve a home country where they can openly and collectively practice their religion. This belief is called Zionism and its necessity was immensely amplified after the Holocaust, the genocide of Jews by the German Nazis. Since the beginning of the 20th century, Zionists have been ominously building Jewish settlements in Palestine, solidifying Jewish culture and education within the region.

Like any other country whose territory was technically going to be occupied, the Arab population feared that Palestine would eventually become a Jewish state, and thus have been engaging in a series of revolts. These include the First and Second Intifadas, or "uprisings", which resulted in the deaths of many on both sides, but significantly higher [on] the Arab side.
