The chewing gum that most people are familiar with first appeared in the 19th century and is an American invention. However, something like chewing gum may go back to thousand[s] of years ago when norther Europeans were chewing tree bark tar. Since then, various cultures have been chewing things like gum in different forms. The ancient Mayans of North America made gum from a material called "chicle" that comes from a special tree.
